Beginners - on lead

Heel with 1 change of direction, 1 halt and 1 sit; Recall (no finish), 30 second down stay

#### **Novice**

Heel on lead with 2 changes of direction and 1 change of pace, 1 halt, 1 sit; Recall off lead (no finish);

Retrieve (any article); 1 minute sit stay (dropped lead) 1 minute down stay (dropped lead)

#### Advanced - off lead

Heel with 3 changes of direction with 1 change of pace, 1 halt, 1 sit; "A" recall with finish; Dead retrieve; (dumb bell - handler to supply); Sendaway with down; 2 minute sit stay off lead; 2 minute down stay off lead

## **OUR PLEDGE**

The primary concern of **Aidens Labradors** and **CreDO - the Campaign for Responsible Dog Ownership** is welfare. We aim to promote the well-being of dogs in everything that we do. All of our judges are qualified, impartial and experienced and committed to our principles.

We do not condone or promote the breeding and rewarding of dogs that display extreme features. We celebrate the diversity of dogs, but every dog that enters our shows will be judged first and foremost on its merits as a dog, regardless of breed. Therefore, every dog should be able to breathe and regulate its temperature without obvious effort, stand and move freely and have a body score recognised as acceptable by the World Small Animal Veterinary Association Global Nutrition Committee. Every dog should display a good temperament with people and other dogs. We recognise that some dogs that have been rescued in the recent past may not yet be in optimal condition and will take that into account. We are also happy to accommodate nervous and inexperienced dogs.

We do not condone harsh treatment or aversive handling. This includes the use of abusive collars, air sprays and threatening, striking, pushing or shouting.

#### We want you and your dog to have the best experience possible at our shows.

There are fields with dog waste bins opposite the hall where your dog can relax between classes. Please clean up after your dog at the show and in the village.

We have delicious refreshments for sale at every show but please dispose of your litter responsibly.

We are happy for you to bring fully vaccinated puppies over 14 weeks of age for a short visit but we do not accept dogs into competition until they are 6 months old and mature enough to cope.

We have ample parking and you may be able to leave your dog outside for short periods, but please remember that dogs die in hot cars. We reserve the right to break into your vehicle if we feel that a dog is in distress and you cannot be contacted.

Please do not bring a bitch to the show if she is about to be in season, is in season or has just finished a season even if she is not competing.

Please warn us if your dog is nervous or new to showing. Our judges are experienced at helping dogs feel comfortable about taking part in a show but please remember that other competitors may not be so aware of your dog's needs.

Please do not let dogs make contact with each other in or near the ring or do anything that could distract the competitors or the judge.

Please keep your dog on a short lead and under control at all times in and around the show.

Please do not let children handle your dog in the vicinity of the show and please keep children quiet and under control at all times. Do not let them touch a dog without asking permission first and please understand that someone may have a good reason for refusing.

Please be careful to pick up dropped food treats as some dogs may have allergies and sensitivities.
